#### INTRODUCTION

The history of the idea of public reason dates back to Hobbes, Kant, and Rousseau. The idea has been revived by John Rawls in his *Political Liberalism* (1993), and has since been the subject of continual heated debate. This workshop, "Public Reason and Bioethics," the first of its kind, aims to examine various conceptions of public reasons – Liberal, Confucian, and Natural Law Theory – and to consider their bearing on issues in bioethics. The investigators consist of three teams, each expounding one conception and arguing for its relevance to bioethics.
