As a social epidemiologist and bioethicist by training, Prof. Chung's research uses the lens of biomedical ethics and justice to examine the social determinants of health and health inequalities. He is currently examining social determinants such as poverty, deprivation, socioeconomic disadvantage, environmental and housing factors, and migrant status. Prof. Chung is also particularly interested in the health of the vulnerable populations, including socially disadvantaged individuals, migrant workers and rare disease patients.

Moreover, he is conducting research on aging-related issues, including long-term/end-of-life care and multimorbidity. He received his BA (Public Health Sciences) from Johns Hopkins University, Master of Science in Bioethics (MBE) from Harvard Medical School, MHS from Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, and PhD from The University of Hong Kong (HKU).
